Message from The Executive Director

Do you find yourself feeling more anxious than usual? Maybe more afraid for the safety of yourself or for the children in your care? Do you have a sense there is a lack of control over your life? Maybe it seems as if your emotions are all over the place? Are you having feelings that you are no longer as patient as you used to be and because of that you are considering giving up fostering?

These can all be signs that you might be experiencing vicarious trauma, which is when the trauma you hear others have experienced impacts you as much as if you had experienced it directly. These signs and others, such as disrupted sleep and intrusive thoughts are normal reactions to the trauma you have been exposed to. Although everyone is affected differently, an indicator of vicarious trauma is feeling more cynical, less hopeful and suspicious. As a caregiver your world might be impacted daily by the trauma others have experienced. Unfortunately we don't always see these signs in ourselves, or we aren't aware of what is causing them, so we don't take the right steps to help us deal with it.

It is inevitable that long-term indirect exposure to trauma will cause caregivers to experience vicarious trauma. Being aware of it is an important first step! Critical Incident magnets

Check your envelope carefully as we have included along with this issue of the Networker, a magnet with important information on how to reach us if you or a Foster Parent you know experiences a Critical Incident.

Information from the Child Protection Branch

The department of Family Services has identified the examination of current child maintenance expenditures as a priority. Expenditures for self-managed respite and child care expenditures (amounts paid directly to care providers as part of their set per diem rate) is an area where further examination is occurring due to significant increases over the past several years.

Effective Jan 1, 2014 any self-managed respite and/or child care support of \$25.00 per day per child and over will require receipts to be submitted to the agency for reimbursement. The approved rate will be seen as a budget and foster parent reimbursement will be based on actual expenditures up to a maximum of the budgeted per diem amount.

The Child and Family Services Division will also be working with the four Authorities to conduct audits on placements where rates are \$150.00 per day or more to gain a complete understanding of current expenditures and what variables are considered in the determination of total compensation to care providers. Placements with multiple children placed will be prioritized as part of this work.

The goal of these changes is to gain thorough information to assist with the new foster care rate structure and identify a consistent system to provide equitable compensation to care providers.
